Regional Express (Rex) has been voted by the *Australian Traveller* Readers' Choice Awards Survey as the "Best Regional Airline".

The Australian Traveller Readers' Choice Awards survey was conducted over the past three months and received nominations from over 1,000 readers on what they consider to be the best in Australia.
