119," he said.

Demand for the Rex lights to and from Adelaide has increased since the olding of O'Connor Airlines in December.

"In January we recorded 100 passengers compared o 7300 in January 2007 then O'Connor was flying ut of Mount Gambier in to delaide and Melbourne, which is an 11pc increase,"

However demand for popular flights in the coming weeks has see fares jump above the \$150 mark, including 5.10pm flight this Friday Adelaide, which was selling yesterday for \$244.

"With Rex now the onl carrier we have tried to maintain a balance between supply and demand, but 60pc of all passengers sind the start of this financial year have traveled on the cheapest fare," Mr Lodg said.

Local Rex flights are als suffering from the nation wide pilot shortage.

Mr Lodge urged th public to bear with the con pany, while they attempte to rectify the situation.

"We are doing everythin we can and hope to go schedule integrity back in our operation." he said.
