2008 Sales: \$2.98 hillion Rank: 4th (mainline/legacy category) Turkish

Airlines-Turk Hava Yollariis performing well despite the gloomy industry environment, and has an ambitious growth plan. The carrier's total score declined a mere 6% from last year-making it one of the least affected by global recession. Turkish ranked second only to Singapore Airlines in the financial health category, and posted a solid liquidity rating. Both its profits and its fleet grew considerably in 2008, and the airline intends to buy 25 long-haul and 50 narrow-body aircraft in the next few years. Thanks to its Istanbul hub, most of Europe and the Middle East are within range of the carrier's large narrow-body fleet.

LAN AIRLINES SA



2008 Sales: \$4.5 billion Rank: 6th (mainline/legacy category)

LAN, strongest of the South American carriers, was a standout in this year's TPC study. The carrier's total score rose by 6%-one of only two legacy airlines to see an increase. LAN ranked first of the major carriers in both earnings performance and asset management categories. Its 2008 profit increased 9% versus the previous year to \$336 million, and while firstquarter 2009 profits were down, it managed to remain in the black. The various LAN affiliates continue to spread throughout South America, with further growth planned this year. The carrier recently completed modernizing its short-haul fleet with Airbus A320-family aircraft, and has substantial orders in place-including 32 Boeing 787s.

REX

Rank: 1st (regional carriers) Australia's Regional Express



Holdings (Rex) is ranked top-by a large margin-of the regional airlines in this year's TPC study. The group is the country's largest independent regional carrier, with commuter brands Regional Express and Air Link, and charter/ cargo airline Pel-Air. The core of the operation is Rex's 38 Saab 340s, but it also flies a number of smaller types for a total fleet of 78. Rex placed first in liquidity, financial health and asset management categories. The group expected to post a profit for the fiscal year ending June 30, albeit down by about 10% compared with the previous year. The Center for Asia Pacific Aviation has twice named Rex regional airline of the year.

AEGEAN AIRLINES

2008 sales: Rank: 4th Clow-cost carriers)



Athens-based Aegean Airlines is financially strong

with a young fleet and an attractive market position. Faced with little competition from local low-cost airlines or from troubled flag carrier Olympic, Aegean posted a \$41-million profit for 2008, with passenger numbers rising 14% to become the top Greek carrier in passenger volume. It also managed a \$6.4-million net profit in first-quarter 2009-a reversal from a loss of about the same size a year earlier. On the fleet side. Aegean ordered nearly 30 Airbus A320-family aircraft in 2007 with deliveries to be completed by 2010. It has taken possession of about half. The carrier has 31 aircraft on international and domestic routes and was accepted into the Star Alliance in May.
